June 27— "The Hobbit"—Little is much when God is in it! We will have a hymn sing that day. Call out your favorites and we will sing them.

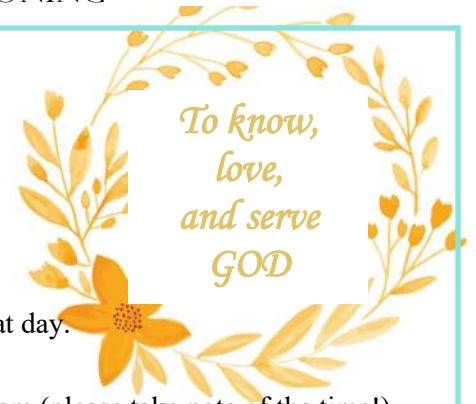
July 4— Community Worship in the park (Eureka Lake) with the other churches at 10:00am (please take note of the time!) Our praise Team will lead the music!

EUMC MISSIONS & MINISTRY

“GO AND MAKE (NEW) DISCIPLES OF ALL NATIONS.....” MATTHEW 28: 18-20

Each quarter a Local, Conference, and National / International mission will be featured. We will have a loose change bucket to place noisy or quiet (bills/checks) financial support. During the month we will learn about the mission and maybe how we can get involved personally.

June Mission Emphasis: Red Bird Mission

Poverty, isolation, and lack of economic opportunity are the overarching circumstances we see in the community that create a variety of needs that are basic to human life and existence. Poverty rate among all people in our counties averages 30%. Hunger is widespread among all age groups. Access to quality education is limited in the public schools that are more distant from these remote communities. The availability of jobs is shrinking in our region as the coal industry in Kentucky has been hard hit by environmental regulations. Housing is inadequate and unsafe for many. The well being of our elderly population is fragile due to their isolation and lack transportation.

Red Bird Mission addresses every one of the needs as funding and resources are available because we live in these communities and have been a part of bringing hope since 1921. We will continue to address hunger and other basic needs of families through case management and delivery of services by our Community Outreach ministries. Our Community Store and Craft Marketing will continue to provide jobs and income for over 100 families and over 90 people are employed through Red Bird Mission and Red Bird Clinic. Housing improvements will continue to be made for hundreds of families and a new home program is beginning that will benefit families whose homes are beyond repair and income is so low that they cannot afford even subsidized low income mortgages.

Red Bird Mission, guided by Jesus Christ, empowers individuals and advocates justice through spiritual, educational, health and community outreach ministries. So that each person fulfills their God given abilities for the good of their family and the community where they live.

Operation Backpack is an equalizing program where Woodford County children, rich or poor, start out the school year just like everyone else - with new school supplies! Last year we served over 165 children in need. This year the sign up for Operation Backpack begins the first week of July, and we are asking that all school supply donations be delivered to Heartline and Heart House **by July 26th**.

If you know of any children who reside in Woodford County and need help with school supplies, please refer their parents to Heartline. We would love to reach out to and help as many children as possible!

From the Crow's nest....

I was watching my grandson learn to walk the other day. This cute little boy fell and got up. And fell and got up, again and again. Too many times to count.

He didn't sit and cry. He even fell onto a slight ramp at one point and rolled back about a foot. Something that would have discouraged anyone and make them upset. But he just got right back up.

Each time he looked straight ahead to where he wanted to be, pulled up his chubby little legs and stepped. There were no tears at each of his failed attempts. He didn't question his legs or comment about how maybe he isn't "meant to" walk. He didn't throw his toy and just sit, in tears or frustration. He tried. Again. And again.

Sometimes he walked great. Other times he toddled and fell back. Plop. Sometimes he fell forward and it looked like it hurt. Ye ouch! But he just got back up and started again. He didn't tell himself he was stupid or that he would never be able to walk. He didn't point to walking people wanting to know why they could walk. He didn't compare his ability or skill to anyone else.

He was a small child learning a big task. Beautifully imperfectly. Jesus calls us to be like a little child. Not childish. But with this kind of attitude. Just do it. If you fall. Get up. If you have a great run, awesome! Keep going! If things don't turn out the way you think, the way you planned, hoped or expected, keep going anyway! You may make mistakes along the way, perhaps even ones that may cause you to roll back farther than you were before. But that is just an opportunity to stable yourself, get back up on your legs and try again.

So, the next time you fall or fail or you feel like life knocks you down, think of this little guy. And then realize that you did the same thing when you walked. When you learned how to get into a chair. When you learned how to go up stairs, grunting, with your little hind end in the air, using the wall to pull yourself forward. But you never gave up!

You have that determination in you! It never left. Pull yourself up! Allow God to help you and **KEEP MOVING!** It may not always be pretty but keep going! ~ Jenny
