Robert's Reflections

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: [a] The old has gone, the new is here new is here!" 2 Corinthians 5:17 NIV

It is All Hallow's Eve. The year is 1517 A.D. The Roman Catholic church has a monopoly of the religious experience of all western Christianity when a young monk and professor named Martin Luther saw the many flaws of the church. He felt moved to debate what he saw were the shortcomings of the church and posted 95 Thesis statements on the door of the church at Wittenberg, Germany. His purpose was not to create a new church. He was wanting to bring renewal to the church he served. Instead, he started the reformation!

Every church as well as any other human institution has flaws. None of us are perfect. We also have a duty to stand for the right and fix what is wrong. As individuals and as a church we must seek forgiveness when we sin and seek to correct our future behavior.

Oh how much we have to debate and seek forgiveness for in our churches today! And like Luther we are called to return to God and His revelation to us in Holy Scripture.

The period following Luther's desire for a debate was filled with more fighting and bloodshed. It was a terrible time in the church. Family divorces are never good. Let us pray that as this change comes about that above all else, God will write his love on our hearts as we seek to be His people. I'll see you in church!



EUMC HISTORY CORNER

We're picking up in 1885. That year, the first school building in Eureka approaching modern standards was constructed at the south end of Callender Street, three blocks south of our church. It provided not only for a graded common school, but also for a high school. That



same year saw Eureka's first phone installed. Dr. N.B. Crawford had a private telephone line installed between his office on Main Street and his home on Darst Street (Dick & Vickie Ridle's current home). It was the



first telephone in Eureka and probably the first in Woodford County.

1886 saw the city of Eureka enter into the water business. The village acquired land at the north end Callender Street and authorized a \$5,000 bond issue. A well was drilled and a water tower was constructed, being a round brick structure rising 670 feet with a wood tank at the top. While it is unknown exactly when our church first acquired running water, it would take another 75 years before our church attained sanitary drinking water from a water fountain.

In 1889, the Epworth League was organized by the young people of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Cleveland, Ohio. It existed in both the northern and southern branches of the Methodist Episcopal denomination. The Epworth League was a structured youth group and the forerunner to what was referred to as the MYF group. The purpose of the league was the promotion of intelligent and vital piety among the young people of the church. The Directory of our church from 1917 shows that the Epworth League was active in our church at that time.

The Galey Chapel was erected south of Eureka and was for a short time an appointment of the Eureka charge. Later the chapel was attached to the Deer Creek Church. Secor was also at various times an appointment of the Eureka circuit. Lster Roanoke and Eureka united.

1893 saw the formation of the Eureka's first electric franchise. Under contract to the city, 20 arc lights were installed above city streets by the Eureka Brick, Tile and Electric Company.

On April 16, 1895 the village of Eureka became incorporated as a City following an election conducted by the village board. A quote from the Woodford County Courier stated, "A great many complaints have been registered against the poor water that the city furnishes. About every other day it has a consumptive color."

Eureka had a one man cigar factory for about 15 years. Albert Gaylor, a native of Germany, came to Eureka in 1897. He was an experienced cigar maker, turning out more than 6,000 cigars annually, rolling each by hand. The brands "Justice" and "Eureka" were a quality smoke priced at ten cents.

In 1898, Roger B. Dickinson, a farmer living south of Eureka purchased and succeeded in reopening the de-

funct cannery by the railroad after an earlier one season failture. The first season they had some 50 men working, packing corn, beans, and tomatoes with an output of around 7,000 cans a day.

In 1901, Dr. J.D. Wyatt purchased a small residence on the corner just south of the Presbyterian Church. In August of that year, he received permission from the city council to remodel the house to provide for his professional office in the north part of the structure and living quarters in the south part. This was the beginning of the facilities which are now known as Carle BroMenn Hospital.
